

2011 Emergency Preparedness

As you prepare for hurricane season, plan for your medical needs, including medications.

Step 1: Get ready.

- **Have a plan.** (In New Orleans, the City-Assisted Evacuation Plan (CAEP) is to help people who have no means of evacuating on their own. Register for online at www.nola.gov.) Listen to WWL 870 AM for updates.
- Keep your prescriptions up-to-date.
- Ask your doctor to give you a copy of helpful medical information—keep this with you.
- Refill your prescriptions a few days before a storm; do not wait until the last minute! Early refills will be offered.
- At all times, keep enough medication on hand to last you at least 14 days.

Step 2: Evacuate when instructed and take:

- All of your medicines and supplements in their *original bottles*, with a back-up list of medications and dosages.
- Helpful medical information - your condition, diagnoses and allergies.
- Your clinic’s name, your doctor’s name and phone number.
- Your most recent hospital card, medication card (ADAP), insurance cards, etc.
- Picture identification, Social Security card, insurance policies, birth certificates and other important legal papers.
- Medical equipment & supplies (dentures, glucometers & strips, nebulizers, crutches, prostheses, etc.)
- First aid kit, battery powered radio, flashlight, cell phone and charger.
- Clothes, sleeping supplies, maps, and personal hygiene items.
- A three day supply of water, non-perishable food and cash.
- A copy of this *document* for easy access to important contact information.

Step 3: Medication, medication, medication – bring it!

- **Make sure you bring all medications with you. Have enough to last you at least 14 days.**
- **IF your anti-HIV virus medications are running out, do NOT skip dosages to stretch them out. Get refills as soon as possible.**
- **IF you do run out of one of your anti-HIV virus medications – stop them all until you get refills.** This does NOT mean that you stop other medications that you may be taking to treat eye or lung infections, to lower blood pressure or cholesterol or to control you diabetes. Ask your doctor or nurse if you have questions about which medications you are taking for different conditions.
- If you use Mumphrey’s Pharmacy, call (504) 259-8061 in the event of an evacuation.
- If you use Avita Pharmacy, call (504) 822-8013 or go visit their website at www.avitadrugs.com.
- If you get your anti-HIV virus medications through the LSU Outpatient Pharmacy at 1400 Poydras Street, you are on **ADAP** and need to call **(504) 568-7474** or the **LA Statewide AIDS/STD Info line at 1-800-992-4379** for assistance. Patients may request refills 15 days early (vs. the normal seven day policy) under a hurricane threat. In declared states of emergency where you would be away from your local hospital or doctor, you may be able to get prescriptions refilled at one of our LSU Hospitals listed below.
