## Our Mission

Delta Region AETC educates clinicians (physicians, dentists, nurse practitioners, physician assistants, nurses, pharmacists) in Louisiana, Mississippi and Arkansas about the rapidly-changing standards of care for individuals with HIV/AIDS. Delta Region AETC is part of a nationwide network providing HIV/AIDS training to health care providers.

## CE Programs for Clinicians

In Louisiana, clinicians can choose from three separate clinical preceptorship courses, held in New Orleans, for these clinician groups: (1) MDs, NPs and PAs (2) Dentists and Hygienists (3) APRNs and RNs. In Mississippi, clinicians can attend a multidisciplinary preceptorship program for primary care providers, held twice a year in Jackson. In Arkansas, clinical preceptorships are available for primary care providers by request in Pine Bluff and Little Rock. In all three states, mini-residencies are arranged for individual clinicians upon request.

## Case Consultation with HIV Experts

Clinicians in Louisiana, Mississippi and Arkansas can call their own state warmlines to consult with HIV experts. Calls are forwarded to peer consultants who return calls with 48 hours (excluding holidays and weekends). Consultants are affiliated with state university medical centers and have expertise in treating/caring for HIV patients. Calls are answered during business hours (Central Time) on weekdays. ## HIV Treatment Guidelines

Rapid dissemination of treatment guidelines and the complex changes that occur as treatment evolves is a prime focus of Delta Region AETC. The target group for this dissemination effort consists of identified HIV treaters in the states of Louisiana, Mississippi and Arkansas.
